
# **2016 TRAVEL TIME ANALYSIS**

### What is Travel Time?

"Travel time" is a term used by the Casualty Actuarial Society (CAS) to denote the number of years it takes a candidate to achieve CAS designations (ACAS or FCAS). Although travel time is defined to start with the first date of full-time actuarial employment, the 2016 Analysis is compiled from data based on date from first examination to allow for a much larger data set.

YEAR OF FIRST PRELIMINARY EXAM

That the expectation for the median time required to move from the first full-time actuarial employment to attainment of Fellowship should be in the range of 5 to 7 years. This translates to 6.5 to 8.5 years from first PRELIMINARY examination.

For the most recent years, we project a median travel time to Fellowship attainment:


- 6.5 years from 1<sup>st</sup> employment
- 8.25 years from 1<sup>st</sup>

# **2016 TRAVEL TIME ANALYSIS**

### **NEW TRAVEL TIME ANALYSIS APPROACH?**

Since 2007, the approach for measuring Travel Time (as seen on page 1) has been based on date from **1**<sup>st</sup> **PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION.** Since the SOA discontinued the agreement with the CAS to offer preliminary exams on a joint basis, entry of candidates into the CAS database is significantly delayed.

In an effort to provide more up-to-date information on candidates who have reached the CAS-administered exams, we have compiled a new set of travel time statistics, based on the travel time from **FIRST CAS EXAMINATION** (Exam 5 or higher).



## **2016 CAS TRAVEL TIME ANALYSIS CONCLUSIONS:**

- Travel time from 1<sup>st</sup> CAS exam to Associateship was somewhat affected by the 2001 syllabus, and has clearly been affected by the 2011 syllabus.
  - Travel time to Fellowship is still at the upper end of the Board of Directors' goal.
