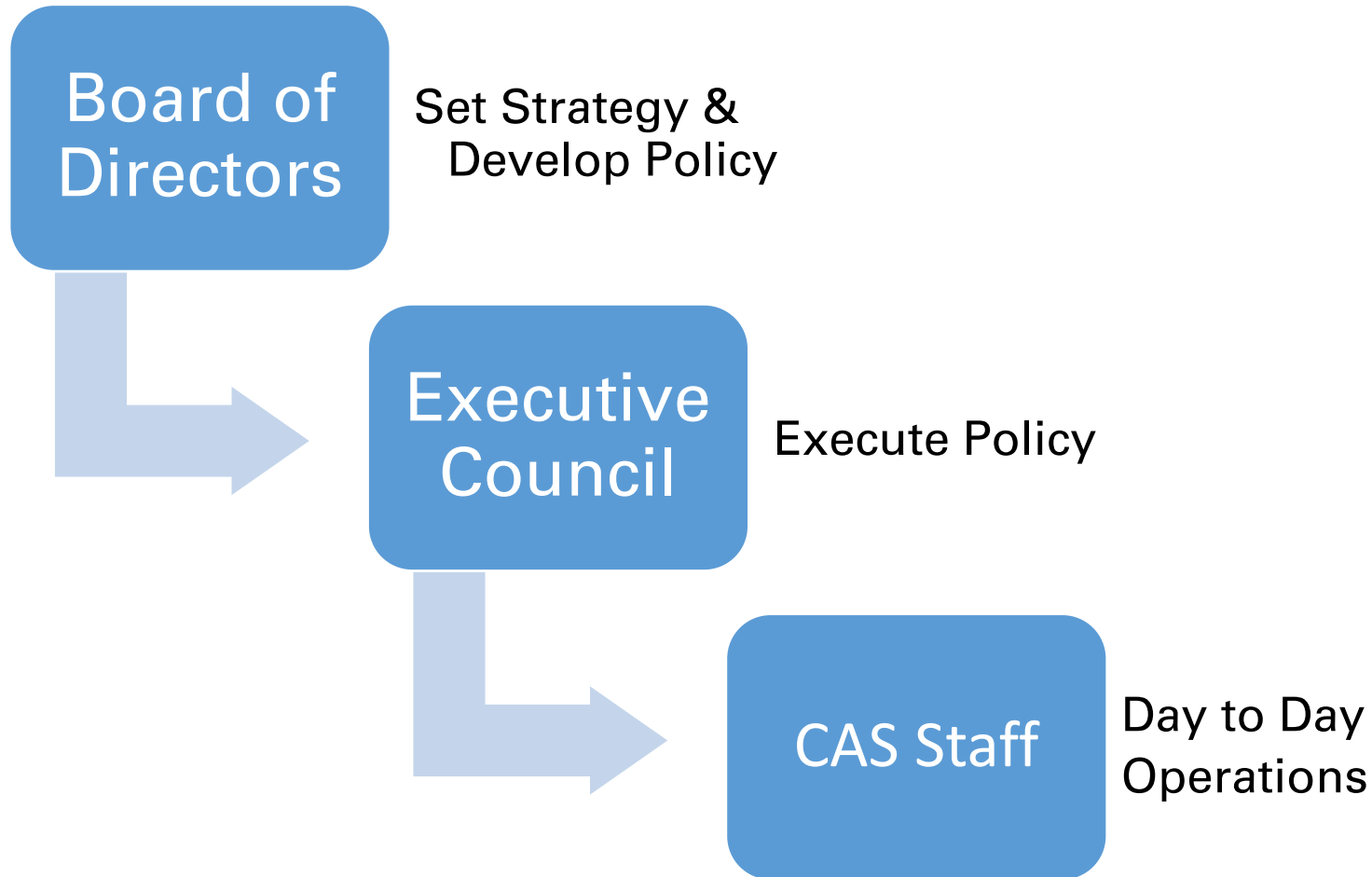

CAS Leadership Structure



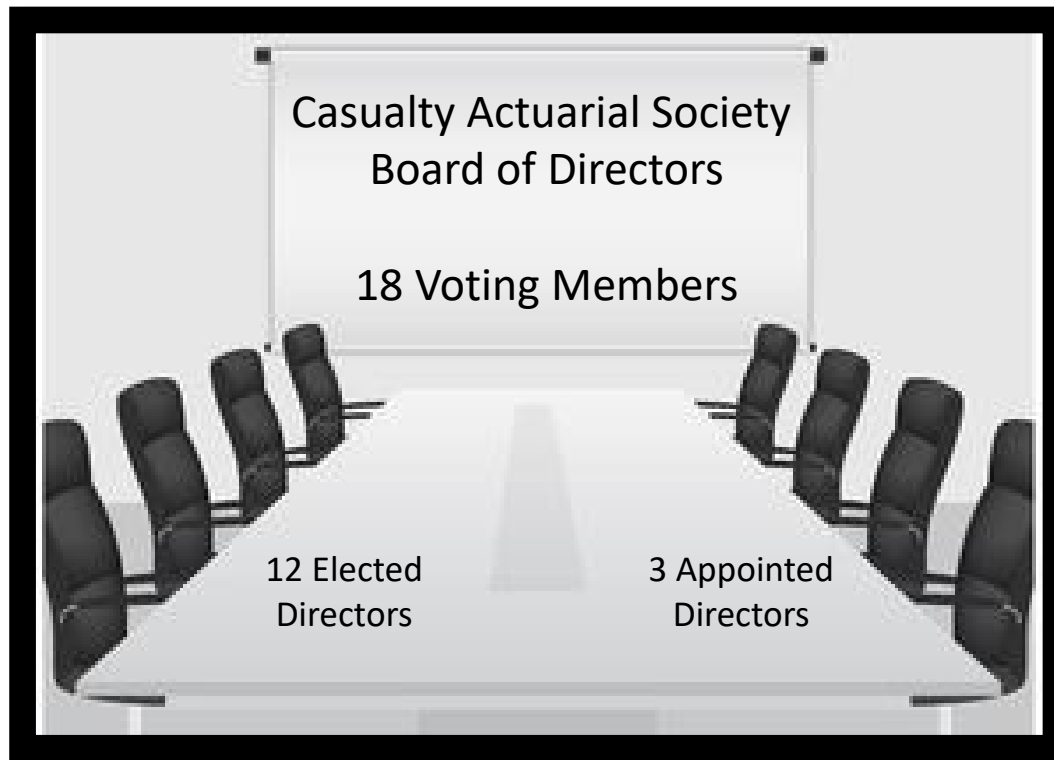

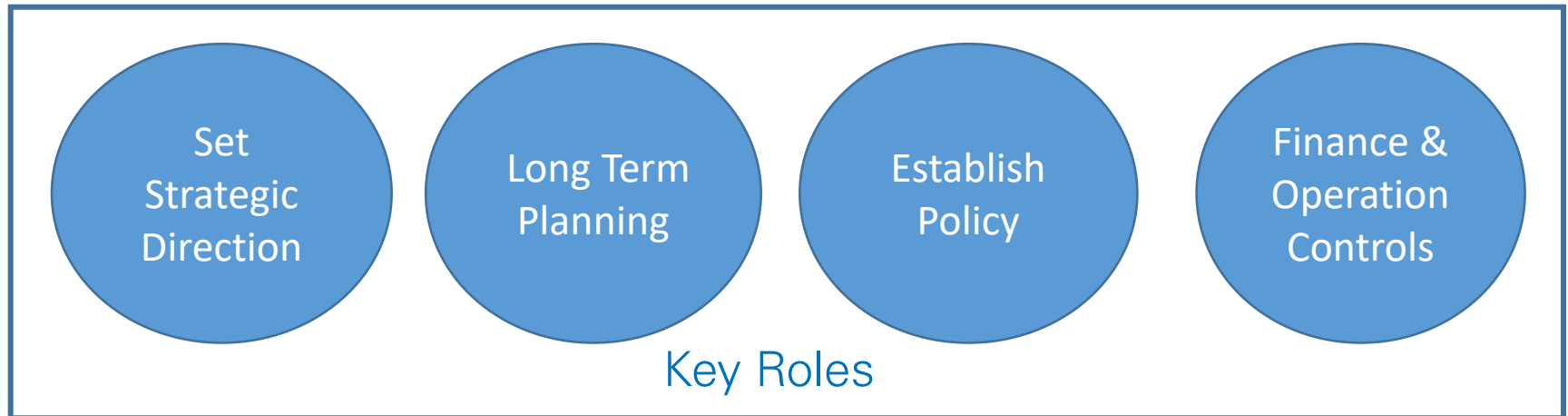

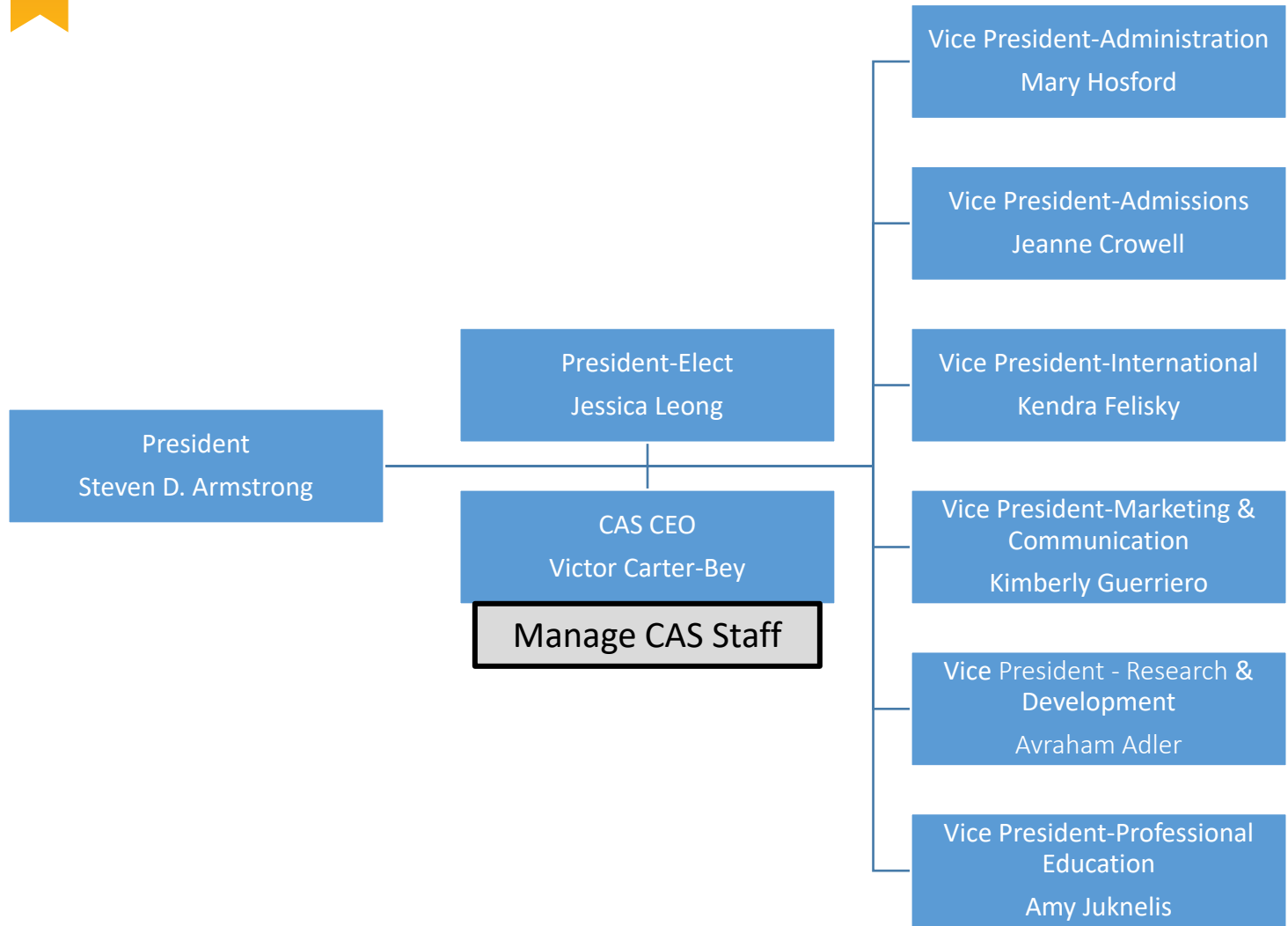
Example of Board Duties

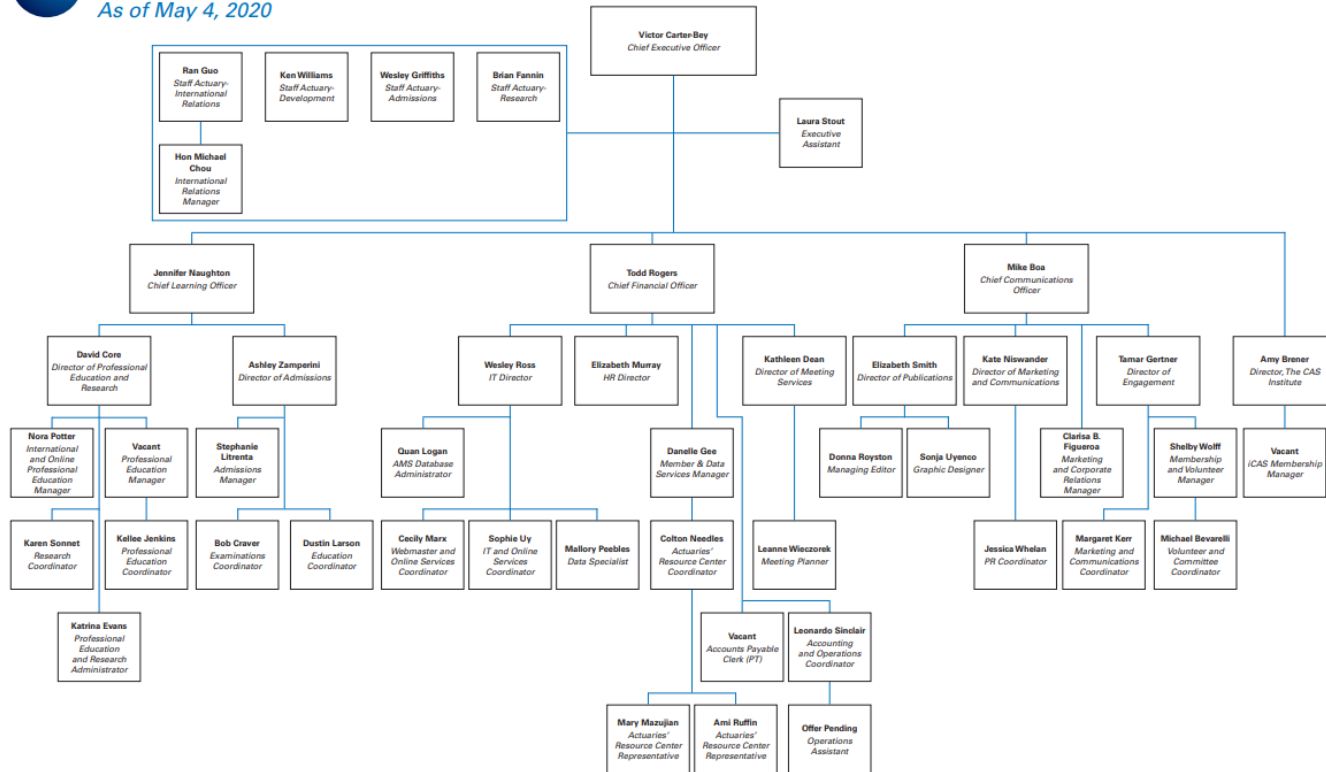
Example of

- Represent the society to members

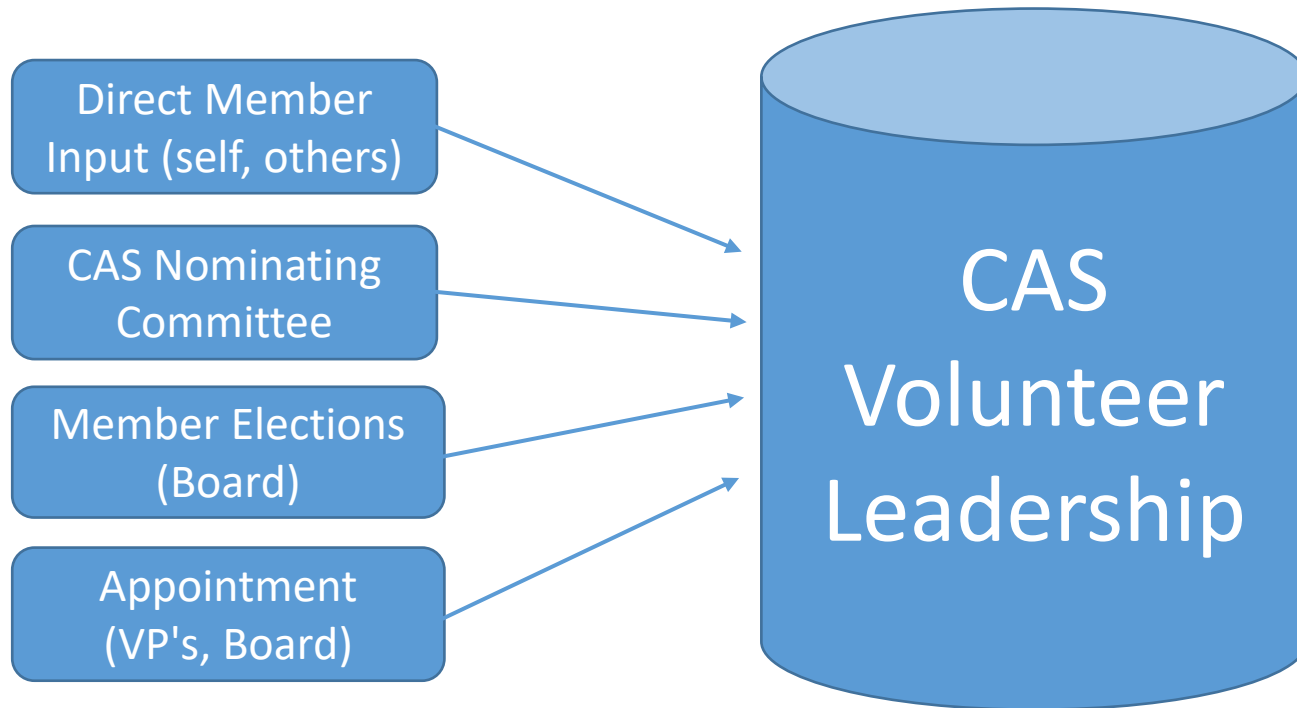


CAS Staff Structure

 As of May 4, 2020



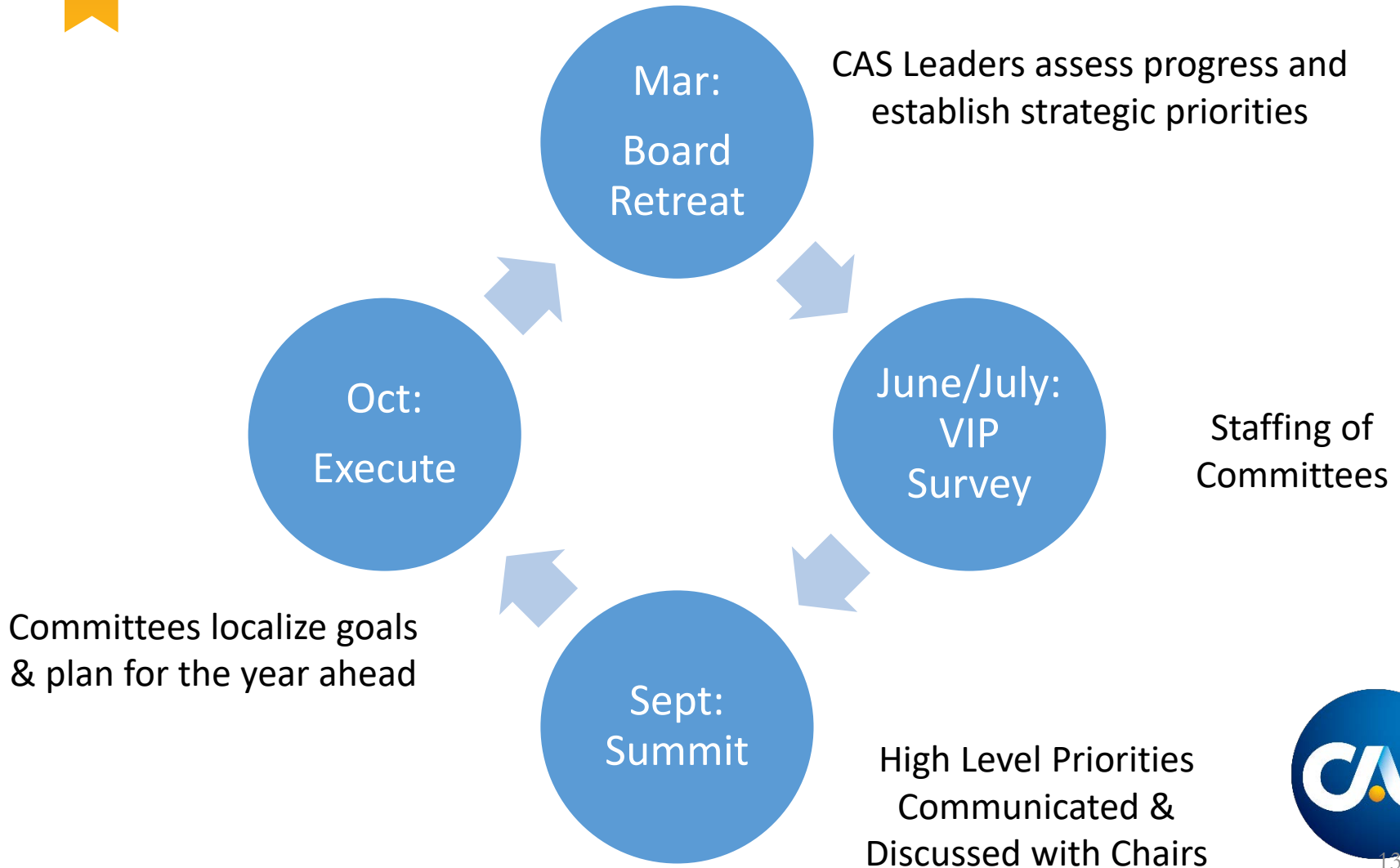
